



World Youth Festival 2024

The World Youth Festival 2024 was held at **Sirius, Russia** from **March 1 to March 7, 2024** under the decree signed by the President of the Russian Federation, Vladimir Putin on April 5th, 2023. The event brought together about 20,000 talented young leaders and specialists from various fields, including education, science, culture, international cooperation, volunteerism, sports, business, journalism and charity from more than 180 countries.

It sought to create an effective and inclusive platform for open conversation and opinion exchange where:

- Everyone can express their point of view and be heard
- Unite to solve social problems
- Help each other build a fair world

The festival aims to provide a chance for starting a dialogue and search for mutual understanding regardless of one's nationality, political views or cultural peculiarities.

It hopes to kickstart new friendships and mutual enrichment of various national cultures and traditions along with ushering in efforts towards implementing practical solutions to build a just world.



The event was organised by Rosmolodezh: Ministry for Youth Affairs of the Russian Federation. The participants' age ranged from **18 to 35 years old**. A total of 20,000 participants, 10,000 from Russia and 10,000 from abroad, attended the event after having passed a competitive selection process.

It fostered a collective vision for the future development of youth. Its agenda included discussions, educational, cultural and sports programs. It strived to consolidate global youth around the idea of justice and strengthen its role in the evolving system of international relations.



Moreover, the **cultural program** was designed to educate the participants about the history, culture and traditions of Russia and other countries. Alongside, the **sports program** allowed the participants to demonstrate their physical fitness and engage in a range of leisure activities.

All activities duly considered the participants' geographical background and address the development issues of various regions of the world (Americas, Middle East, Africa, Europe, Asia and Oceania). The **six official languages of the UN** (Russian, English, Arabic, Spanish, Chinese and French) have been chosen as the working languages of the festival.





Furthermore, the opening date of the festival coincided with the 10th anniversary of the end of the Winter Olympic Games in Sochi in 2014, and the Olympic Park served as the primary venue.

The festival's regional program took place from March 10-17, allowing participants to explore 30 cities across Russia.

The Indian delegation comprised a vibrant group of about 360 young Indians.



According to Petr Sizov, head of the press service at the Russian Embassy in New Delhi, the passenger list included high school and university students, young scientists, political leaders, educators and entrepreneurs - both male and female. Rakesh, one of the delegates, highlighted how the "Bharat-360" team had united 360 young delegates from across India to represent the country at the WYF 2024.

Valuable feedback of participants across the globe has also been extensively recorded who extolled their dynamic experience at the World Youth Festival, 2024.
