



Strengthening India-Russia Academic Ties: BRICS XVI Summit Hosts Round Table on Educational Cooperation

As part of the XVI BRICS Summit, a high-level round-table dialogue on India-Russia educational cooperation, "India-Russia: Emerging Economies," was held yesterday at the Constitution Club of India, New Delhi. Organized by the BRICS International Forum in collaboration with the Financial University under the Government of the Russian Federation and universities from Delhi and NCR, the event brought together leading academic and government representatives to advance strategic educational partnerships.

The program commenced with a formal reception for the Financial University delegation at Jamia Millia Islamia University, followed by a ceremonial welcome at the Constitution Club of India. The dignitaries were greeted with traditional flower arrangements and a ceremonial lamp lighting, symbolizing the shared vision for advancing academic collaboration and cultural exchange.

In her opening remarks, **Ms. Purnima Anand, President of the BRICS International Forum**, emphasized the importance of academic alliances in the BRICS framework.
